

Aesthetic Pruning Program 2024/2025 Schedule

Structural Pine Pruning for Character: Saturday, October 5, 2024, 1-3pm - \$45

LAURA DUFALA, INSTRUCTOR: Bio on back side.

Watch Laura unlock the hidden character of a pine tree by removing unnecessary branches and needles, both for the aesthetics and the health of the pine tree. Laura will demonstrate pruning in the niwaki method on a variety of pine trees at the Gresham Japanese Garden.

Propagating Conifers from Cuttings, Saturday, November 2, 2024, 1-3pm- \$55 NORM JACOBS INSTRUCTOR: Bio on back side.

Learn how to successfully propagate Chamaecyparis, Cryptomeria, Tsuga, Thujopsis and other suitable conifers by rooting cuttings. Instructor Norm Jacobs will decode plant physiology, explain the selection of containers, soil mixes, and the role of rooting compounds. Norm will demonstrate, and you will prepare the cuttings from branches and sticks. Last Norm will share his experience about aftercare and future transplanting of your cuttings. Class will take place in GJG's Kyoudou Center and includes all the propagation materials: pots, soil, rooting compound, and plant tags that you'll take home. And, there will be time for questions and answers.

Assessing and Pruning an Overgrown Landscape: Saturday, November 23, 2024, 1-3pm: \$45 FRANCHESKA SNYDER, INSTRUCTOR: Bio on back side.

Knowing where to begin managing an overgrown garden can be overwhelming. This workshop will take place at a residential home in the Gresham area (TBD) that speaks to the issues around this workshop. Instructor Francheska Snyder will walk you through how to prioritize tasks, how to prune based on the space, plant material, and hardscapes near. You will have the opportunity to observe while Francheska prunes a shrub and a specimen tree in this overgrown landscape. There will be time for questions too!

Hands-on Winter Pruning Workshop, Onsite: Saturday, January 11, 2025 10am–4pm - \$100 FRANCHESKA SNYDER, INSTRUCTOR: Bio on back side.

This workshop is designed for the intermediate pruner looking to advance their pruning knowledge through experiential learning at a Japanese garden. Taught by GJG pruning instructor and owner of Niwa Methods, Francheska Snyder, this workshop will take place at Vanport International's Japanese garden in Boring, Oregon. Snyder will speak to the current state of this Japanese garden, about Japanese garden design and how to approach the overgrown issues at hand. All participants will prune a variety of plants and trees dependent on the needs. Workshop will be limited to 12 participants for optimal experience.

Instructor Norm Jacob says that we are in a period of change in the world of Japanese maples, are in a period of "changing of the guard" in the world of Japanese maples with the future uncertain. That said, many select introductions of the last 30 years (the period of my most intense activity) are still rare or just making their way into propagation in numbers adequate to lower prices and improve availability. New plants continue to enter our evaluation program each year. This class will focus on JMs introduced during 1980-2018. Pruning Fruit Trees, January 25, 2025 1-3pm: \$45 JONATHAN FAITH, INSTRUCTOR

Late winter pruning is a good time to prune fruit trees because it is dormant and easy to see the tree's structure to decide which cuts to make, and you can rest assured knowing that the spring is not far off and your tree will soon be able to heal any wounds from pruning. Instructor Jonathan Faith will be demonstrate how to prune apple trees, cherry trees, and hopefully if Al's Garden & Home has in stock, plum trees and Asian pear trees.

In addition to demonstrating how to prune each variety of fruit tree, Jonathan will discuss cross pollination, fertilizers, and fungicide and insecticide sprays. 
Laura teaches Structural Pine Pruning for Character, and Spring Maintenance on Pines

Maryann Lewis is an APA Certified Aesthetic Pruner[®] and a co-founder of the Aesthetic Pruners Association (APA). In 2012 she began teaching various aesthetic pruning classes with the Marin Master Gardeners Pruning Guild. In 2022 Maryann was one of three pruning instructors for the International Japanese Garden Training Center's Waza to Kokoro seminar. Maryann has taught workshops and given presentations for the APA, the American Conifer Society, The Hoffman Center for the Arts in Manzanita Oregon, the JM Winery in Woodinville Washington, and now the Gresham Japanese Garden.
